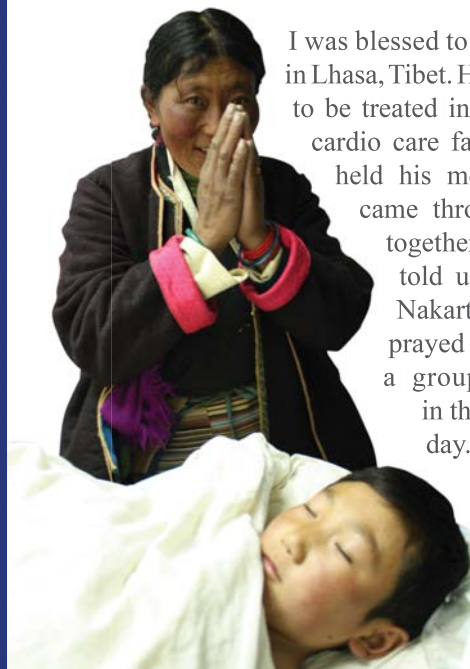

Over 500 children were visited and several kids treated for congenital heart defects. This was our first declaration of faith in Nakartse. I was blessed to meet Sang Zu this year in Lhasa, Tibet. He was the very first child to be treated in the SEAPC-sponsored cardio care facility. He and his mother prayed to know Jesus with a group of young believers in the hospital the following day.

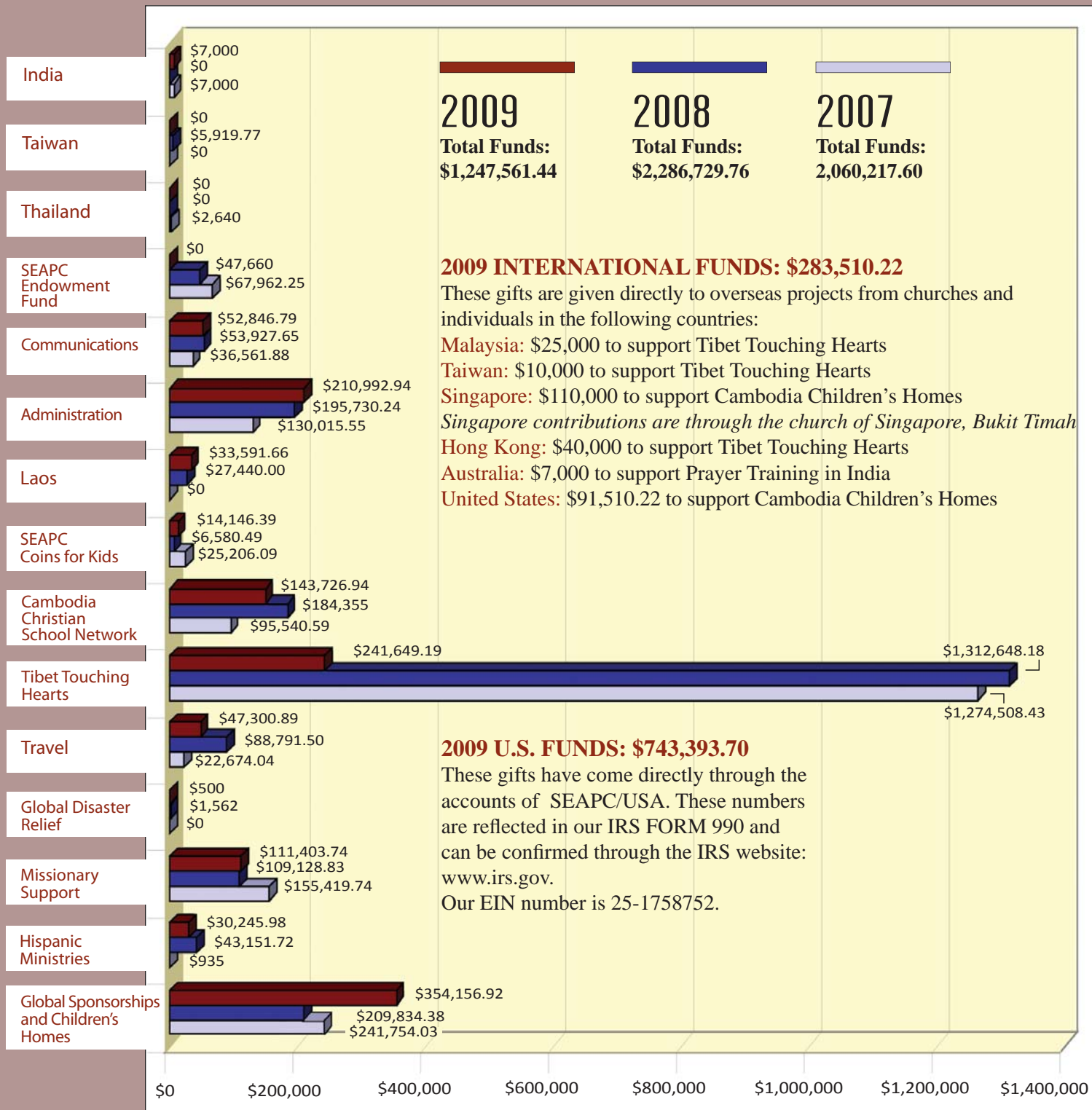

In 1992, we moved back to Cambodia and faced many difficulties. My mom's faith started to lower but eventually, she went to church again. Dad didn't believe in God until he became seriously ill and mom told him to shout to Jesus Christ. He followed her advice and said, "If the Jesus Christ is the true God, let him heal my sickness. I will receive Jesus Christ as my savior." His health was restored ... He forsook the witchcraft and accepted Jesus. 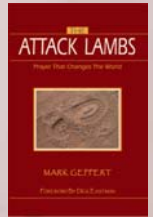

Bridges



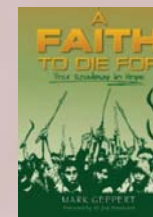
