Dear Friend,

It is my great joy to welcome you to this annual report of the South East Asia Prayer Center. 2008 was a banner year for us in many ways: we saw more people come to the knowledge of Jesus, more children successfully treated for heart disease, more schools built and more baptisms than ever before.

Even in the face of difficult economic times, our cash flow remained solid and the SEAPC Global Community increased as we were able to establish the Hispanic Ministries Training Center in Little Rock, Arkansas, and the Hope Garden in Laos.

It has been a year of increase, abundance, and accolades; but, as nice as that is, we are not deceived and do not intend to rest upon our laurels. Jesus has brought us this far to prepare us for the ascent ahead.

While we do have 3,600 children in our schools in Cambodia and have successfully treated over 300 children in Tibet, there are millions waiting to receive a tangible touch from the hand of Jesus. His love demonstrated through health, education, parenting and micro-economic development has become the foundation for their faith. They have experienced Jesus in a way they shall never forget.

This report places us at the "Base Camp" of what is going to be a very arduous journey to accomplish the goals of 9,000 children treated,

Heart Care Groups established in Tibet and 24 Community Education Centers established in Cambodia.

Our Faith Proposal for these 2 projects is 21 million dollars over 5 years or just over 4 million per year. Our projects and operations costs in other nations will push that number to 5 million for this year and a need to increase by 15% each subsequent year.

Persistent Prayer has brought us this far and Persistent Prayer will take us to the top. These families can be saved and healed and given a bright future as we commit to pray as never before. God has brought us this far and He will see us through.

Please enjoy this report and join with me in awe at God's goodness and commitment to bring the nations before Him daily in prayer.

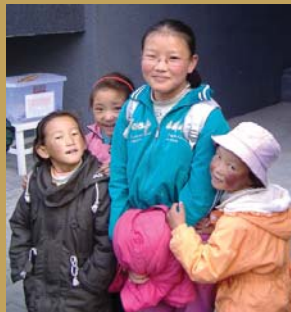

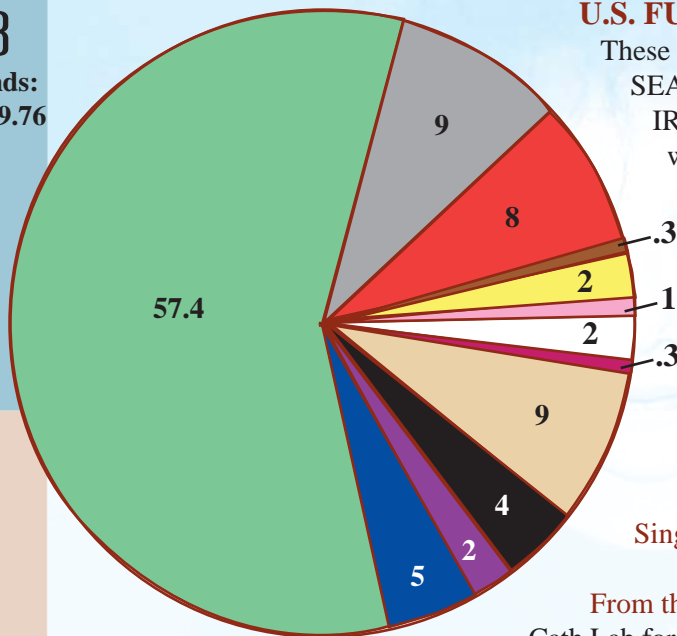

Bridges



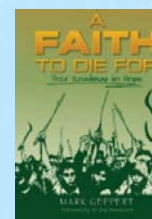
Twelve crucial steps to abundant living and practical advice for growing in the everyday. This book gives the reader simple biblical principles to stand on through the hard lessons of life.
